2012 ANDREW YORK RUBBER DUCKY DROP

The 2012 Andrew York Rubber Ducky Drop is held to benefit the Andrew York Lineman Scholarship Fund, to provide scholarships to high school seniors who have been active in the community, specifically in the prevention of drug and alcohol abuse.

- Up to 4,000 ducks will be dropped from a bucket truck at the Andrew York Lineman Rodeo grounds at Walla Walla Point Park at approximately *noon on Saturday, June 16, 2012 during the rodeo intermission.*
 - Eight Frisbees will be numbered 1-8, each number corresponding with a numbered prize listed on the 2012 Ducky Drop ticket. Frisbees will be randomly placed on the ground and anchored.
 - If only one numbered duck lands on a Frisbee it will win the corresponding prize.
 - If two or more ducks land on a Frisbee the closest duck to the “blue dot” on the Frisbee will win the corresponding prize. A measuring tape will be used to measure the distance.
 - If no ducks land on a Frisbee the closest duck to the “blue dot” on the Frisbee will win the corresponding prize. A measuring tape will be used to measure the distance.

GENERAL EVENT RULES

The Andrew York Lineman Rodeo has established the following scoring rules to provide the greatest degree of fairness, accuracy, and speed in tabulating the final results.

We strive for fair, accurate and consistent judging.

Schedule and scoring procedure:

1. Teams/Apprentices will line up in the staging area for each event. The order of the team/apprentice in the line will determine their sequence in entering the event. Teams/Apprentices will have to check in and checkout of each event and will have a designated amount of time to check in to each subsequent event or will be deducted points.
2. The scoring sheets are three-part carbonless forms. Once the team/apprentice enters each event staging area, the Judge will complete the necessary information on the three-part scoring sheets.
3. Individual names will need to be entered on the Team Speed Climb and Hurt Man Rescue events.
4. The event descriptions will be in the team registration handout. After check in, a team or apprentice number will designate each team or apprentice. Each team or apprentice will be provided three-part, carbonless scoring sheets for each event.
5. Teams/Journeymen/Apprentices/Groundmen may **ONLY** use the following personal tools and each **MUST HAVE A MINIMUM OF 6 TOOLS LISTED BELOW CARRIED AT ALL TIMES IN ALL EVENTS:**
 - a. Lowel Wrench
 - b. Knife
 - c. Crescent Wrench
 - d. Screwdriver
 - e. Hammer
 - f. Speed Wrench
 - g. Channel Locks
 - h. Counts as one tool: Belt, Skid and Harness (if needed)
***** Rope skids will not be allowed.**
6. **All event tools and equipment will be provided by the Andrew York Lineman Rodeo Association.**
7. Upon entering the entrance area for each event, the team/apprentice will meet with a Judge. Teams/apprentices will provide the Judge with their scoring sheet for the particular event. The Judge will explain the rules for the event, and answer any questions. Team/apprentices will have a total of five minutes to question the Judge concerning particulars of the event and lay out their tools. However, teams/apprentices will not be allowed to ask the Judge questions during the event.



GENERAL EVENT RULES (continued)

8. The Judge will show the team/apprentice their event judging area and will notify the team/apprentice when to begin the event.
9. If the mean time for the event is surpassed, a 2-point deduction will be made. The team or apprentice will be given an additional 5 minutes to complete the event. If the event is not completed within the additional 5 minutes, an additional 2-point deduction will be made and the event stopped.
10. Upon completion of the event, the Judge will escort the team/apprentice to the exit area. The Judge, will review the scoring sheet with the team. Teams/Apprentices will have 5 minutes to discuss the scoring with the Judge and/or Chief Judge if need be.
11. Each team/apprentice will be given one copy of the three-part event form. One copy of the scoring sheet will remain with the Judge and the original given to the scorekeeper. Once teams leave the event area that event is considered completed and no further discussion surrounding that event will be allowed.
12. Any teams, team members or apprentices interrupting or questioning the scorekeepers will result in a 20-point deduction.
13. All results determined by the scorekeeping group are final.
14. Video footage will not be allowed to settle judging disputes.
15. Any participants attending the IBEW annual picnic's beer garden or who appear to be intoxicated prior to competing in any or all rodeo events, will be disqualified and ineligible to participate in the Andrew York Lineman Rodeo at the judges discretion. No reimbursement for entry fees will be given.
16. All teams and apprentices will follow the sequence of events as laid out in their packet in order to keep the rodeo timely and expeditious.

CONTESTING A CALL:

The rodeo has a Chief Judge. If the team wants to contest a call they must take it to the Chief Judge. The Chief Judge will try to settle the dispute. The dispute must be brought to the attention of the Chief Judge before the team leaves the event.

EVENT POINTS:

Each apprentice event is worth a total of 100 points. The apprentice test is worth up to 100 points and each question may be weighted at 4 points. Team events are worth 100 or 200 points depending on the event.

CHIEF JUDGE:

The Chief Judge will be free to move about the rodeo ground and will watch for inconsistencies in judging and bad or unfair calls. If any are noticed, the Chief Judge will pull the event Judge off to the

side and point the errors out to him. If the event Judge persists and continues to make bad calls he will be asked to leave the event.

Judges and team/apprentice members are to treat each other with fairness, respect and courtesy.

JUDGING EVENTS:

Events will be judged for the following:

- Safety
- Work practices
- Neatness and ability
- Equipment handling
- Timely completion of the event



OTHER NOTABLE INFORMATION:

- Contestants must wear long sleeve shirts. **NO SHORT SLEEVES.**
- Misuse of tools is not permitted.
- No dropping tools or hardware.
- Hardhats must be worn properly. Not loose or backwards.
- Use proper cover.
- You must conduct yourself professionally!

Journeyman Event Information

1. **Energized Insulator Change-out**

Scenario: A 45-foot pole with three cross arms. The top two 11-foot arms have four 3Ø 12kV circuits on them – one on each side of the pole on each arm. The bottom 9-foot arm has two 3Ø open wire 120/240 secondary circuits – one on each side of the pole.

Objective: Change out one glass insulator with copper conductor and old wood pin on center phase of the pole on the middle arm (either side). Journeyman must maintain all legal, safe working distances and protect themselves and groundmen from incidental contact. Cover, hot sticks and hand lines will be provided. (Journeyman must start event with tools ON. Time starts when judge says go and stops when both journeymen have both feet on the ground, housekeeping complete, hand line made up and sticks and equipment are back on working tarp.)

2. **Energized Regulator Jumper Change-out**

Scenario: A 45-foot pole with vertical 1Ø construction – 12kV #2 ACSR wire. Pole-mounted bypass switch with a pole-mounted regulator. Electronic regulator control box mounted at the base of the pole.

Objective: Change out the jumper from the regulator load-side bushing to the bottom of the bypass switch. Journeyman team must illustrate sequence of steps to bypass a regulator safely, then cover the hot side of bypass switch and change-out the load-side jumper from regulator to bypass switch. Journeyman must maintain all legal, safe working distances and protect themselves and ground men from incidental contact. After both journeymen are on the ground, journeymen must illustrate sequence of steps to put regulator back online and restore regulator. (Journeyman must start event with tools OFF. Time starts when judge says go and stops when both journeymen have both feet on the ground, regulator is restored, housekeeping complete, hand line made up and sticks and equipment returned to working tarp. If journeymen illustrate sequence of steps to bypass or restore regulator incorrectly, deduction(s) will be given.)

3. **Hurt Man Rescue / Pole Top**

Objective: Rescue the “injured lineman” as quickly as possible from a pole using all legal, safety procedures and pole top rescue techniques. In this event, one team member calls dispatch to request ALS, provides information on the accident, gives location and confirms. Second and third team member “rescue” the victim, one on the pole and the other on the ground. (Time stops when mannequin touches the ground. Both lineman will do a rescue and both times will be scored.)

4. **Speed Relay Mystery Event**

If we told you, it wouldn't be a mystery!

Apprentice Event Information

1. **Written Test**

2. **Speed Climb**

Objective: Climb and descent a 45-foot pole as quickly and smoothly as possible. This is the only event where you get to show-off your speed. The apprentice will climb the pole with an egg in a grunt bucket, then descend the pole with egg in mouth in order to measure smoothness. (Time stops when first foot touches ground.)

3. **Hurt Man Rescue / Pole Top**

Objective: Rescue the “injured lineman” as quickly as possible from a pole using all safety procedures and pole-top rescue techniques. (Mean time: 10 minutes)

4. **Relay Mystery**

If we told you, it wouldn't be a mystery!

5. **Secondary Insulator Change-out**

Scenario: A secondary clevis insulator broke on a 35 foot service pole with secondary triplex wire attached at the top of the pole in two places. (This is a 35 foot secondary service pole that has double dead-ended secondary with slack in between the dead ends.)

Objective: Cleanly and safely remove broken clevis side insulator and re-dead end the wire with a new service wire grip dead end also known as a “chicken catcher.” Apprentice must climb pole with hand line and new clevis insulator and chicken catcher securely in ditty bag. (Time stops when both feet are on the ground, both hooks are off and covers on hooks with hand line made up. Once complete, apprentice must tell the judge to “stop time.” If the apprentice says “stop time” before both hooks are off and covers on hooks with hand line made up, they will receive a 10-point deduction and will not be able to have time restarted to correct mistake.)

Driving Directions to Wenatchee's Walla Walla Point Park:



From the Seattle area: Traveling on I-90, take second Cle Elum exit (Exit 85). At stop sign take a left and cross over freeway and take a right and head to Wenatchee via Hwy 97/Blewett Pass. At end of pass, turn right onto Hwy 2/97 to Wenatchee. Continuing into the city of Wenatchee from Hwy 97, you will be on Wenatchee Avenue. Turn left off Wenatchee Ave onto Hawley St, which becomes N. Miller St. Follow road to Walla Walla Ave and turn left (sign to Lowe's Hardware). Follow road to Walla Walla Point Park.



From Stevens Pass: Follow Hwy 2/97 east to Wenatchee. Continuing into the city of Wenatchee from Hwy 97, you will be on Wenatchee Avenue. Turn left off Wenatchee Ave onto Hawley St which becomes N. Miller St. Follow road to Walla Walla Ave and turn left (sign to Lowe's Hardware). Follow road to Walla Walla Point Park.

From Spokane area: Follow I-90 east to the Quincy/Wenatchee exit at George. Take Hwy 28 to Quincy. Go west approximately 30 miles to East Wenatchee on Hwy 28. Once you enter East Wenatchee, stay in left lane and cross over George Seller Bridge to Wenatchee. Once on bridge, move to right hand lane and take first exit off bridge (Wenatchee Ave). Head north on Wenatchee Ave. to Ninth St. and take a right. Go over railroad tracks and follow road around to left and go approximately 1/2 mile to entrance of Walla Walla Point Park.
